(Boston, MA) — Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts will host its 6th Annual STEM Conference and Expo at on Sunday, March 18 from 9 AM to 5 PM at the Sheraton Framingham Hotel and Conference Center. Girls in grades 6–12 will spend the day learning and exploring through a series of fun, hands-on workshops, live demonstrations, and experiments. Girls will also receive an event patch.

Dynamic leaders from STEM fields will present and share their knowledge on coding, toxicology, biochemistry, and more. Workshops for Cadette, Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts at GSEMA's 2018 STEM Conference and Expo will include:

- Physics of Flight with Kites: Girls can make a small kite, use it for experiments, and then take it home!
- Exploring Circuits Through Art: The Society of Women Engineers (SWE) combine engineering and art through creative projects, including an LED greeting card.
- Keeping an Eye on the Stars: By making their own model telescope, girls will discover how telescopes collect light, as well as how models are used in science and engineering.
- Meet Your Meat: Not for the squeamish! Participants dissect meat to determine whether it is safe to eat.
