### **Program support**

We offer more than 500 interactive girl programs and workshops each year for 35,000 girls, ages 5-17 in 178 communities.

### **Campership Fund**

Every summer, we provide camp assistance to more than 400 girls.

Our Leading Women Awards offer a variety of sponsorship opportunities that allow you to show your support for girls and our mission while participating in an uplifting networking event.

### **Volunteer opportunities**

As the largest girl-serving organization in the Commonwealth, we offer a variety of flexible ways for corporate employees to volunteer, making it easy for each employee to find the right fit for his/her interests and abilities. Below are just a few ways that employees can become engaged with Girl Scouts.

#### *Camp Cleanup*

Every summer, we proudly offer quality camp programming to more than 3,000 girls at seven camp properties. We provide "work days" at each of our camps in the spring, where groups help the staff clean up the spaces after the New England winter to keep them fun and safe places for girls to learn and grow.

#### *FaB Factor*

The FaB Factor brings the Girl Scout experience to girls in target communities that are historically underserved by Girl Scouting. Each site is supported by a trained staff member and provides weekly after-school programming divided into four modules: financial literacy; Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM); leadership development; and health and wellness. We seek volunteers to share their expertise with our girls by serving as guest speakers.

#### *Gold Award Program*

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award Girl Scouts ages 14-18 may earn. Volunteers are needed to support and mentor individual girls as they work to earn the Gold Award. Mentors will meet or speak periodically with their advisee to review project status, troubleshoot to solve problems, and help her develop project management skills.
