Previously, she was the vice president for engineering and science at Nobis Engineering, Inc., where she was on the firm's management and executive boards and led large-scale environmental engineering projects. Heather has been active in local politics, including serving on the Board of Selectman, Board of Public Works, Conservation Commission, Affordable Housing, and Recycling Committee for the Town of Hamilton, MA. She is the founder of The Hamilton Foundation, a nonprofit organization providing short-term financial relief to local families since 2005. Under the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE), Heather was a Legislative Fellow working at the Massachusetts State House, supporting Commonwealth engineering projects with state legislators. Currently, she represents ASCE as an ABET accreditation program evaluator for nationwide Civil Engineering programs. Heather also currently serves on the Northeastern University Civil Engineering Industrial Advisory Board. She is a member of The Boston Club, which promotes the advancement of women to significant and visible leadership roles; she currently is providing mentoring to other leaders as part of the Club's mentoring program. Heather has served on the GSEMA board since 2017 and is a member of the Long-Range Property Planning Committee. Heather served as a Girl Scout leader for 12 years and helped eight young women earn the Girl Scout Gold Award.
