As chief executive officer, Caitríona Taylor brings her commitment to female empowerment to the girls and volunteers of Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts. A visible and high-impact leader, Caitríona served as Director of Campus Recreation of Boston College from 2011 to 2019, where she was responsible for a diverse portfolio of programs, including youth camp and outdoor adventures, for more than 20,000 people. During her tenure, she managed the professional development of more than 500 staff and 100 volunteers, and established funds to increase program access for students in the lowest 10% income bracket. Through certification by the Anti-Defamation

League, she facilitated staff and volunteer trainings on identity, diversity, gender, sexual orientation, race, and discrimination. Additionally, she instituted new codes of conduct systems to prevent hazing, sexual assault, and alcohol abuse; introduced Bystander Intervention and Title IX training to student clubs and staff; and developed updated protection of minors' policies and procedures. And as recreation and athletic project manager, she provided critical leadership in launching Boston College's new \$150 million, 244,000 square-foot recreation center.

Caitríona's entrepreneurial experience includes roles as co-founder and vice president of sales of active lifestyle clothing company Crane & Lion, and as president of eco-friendly yoga product start-up Kulae. Caitríona earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in international relations from Boston University, and has worked in recreation and athletic departments at MIT and Boston College, where she would later earn a Master of Business Administration in global administration and a Master of Higher Education, student affairs.
