“More than 20,000 Girl Scouts in our region, from grades K through 12, stepped up to become cookie entrepreneurs this season, and they’ve learned the skills to succeed in life while also funding new adventures and community service projects!” says Caitríona Taylor, CEO of Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts. “Our Girl Scouts were fortunate to that our cookie program concluded before public safety restrictions around Covid-19 went into effect, and we encourage cookie fans to support other councils around the country who are still selling cookies online.”

Through the Cookies for a Cause program, Girl Scouts collected more than 33,000 cookie package donations for food pantries, military, and healthcare facilities (the most donations in 12 years!). While GSEMA’s annual spring Cookies for a Cause event at Hanscom Airforce Base was cancelled, many local troops have been donating their remaining Girl Scout Cookie inventory to local hospitals to support those on the front lines of Covid-19.
