
# Council Updates for Membership Year 2022-23

#### **Community Engagement**

Community Engagement focuses on recruitment, retention and outreach within communities that need additional support to deliver the full Girl Scout experience and programming. This team aims to *identify and minimize barriers* that may prevent a Girl Scout member from participating in Girl Scout activities such as transportation, language, cultural differences or financial concerns so that we can bring the Girl Scout Leadership Experience to girls who may not otherwise have access to Girl Scouting.

We provide additional resources to Troop Leaders, volunteers and families to build confidence in their decisions and participation in Girl Scouting. We also develop community partnerships with places such as schools, libraries, community centers, places of worship, and housing authorities to meet potential Girl Scouts where they are.

Exciting opportunities coming soon include:

- *Multicultural Heritage celebrations* via virtual program and self-guided activities where Girl Scouts celebrate and learn about the cultural richness of the diverse communities that make up the United States.
- *Lift Your Voice self-guided patch program* which centers around advocacy, exploring cultures, identity, and racism—inspiring girls to embrace their voices, self-images, and to feel confident with their authentic selves. All members are encouraged to participate!

We understand there are communities outside of our regions that may need similar supports and we are actively growing our Community Engagement programming—reach out to Customer Care if you'd like to know more!



### Volunteer Support, Training and Safety

## FORMS AND DOCUMENTS are being updated. Highlights include:

- Former Girl Scout Activity Form was renamed <u>GSEMA</u> <u>Safety Approval Form</u>.
- <u>Safety Activity Checkpoints</u> were updated twice this year, with more than 20 updates this year, including a number of activities no longer requiring a <u>GSEMA Safety Approval</u> <u>Form</u> (like hiking and outdoor cooking).
- The Certificate of Liability List is retired and replaced by a more staff-facing process to ease volunteer responsibility. We're also working on increasing the number of <u>GSEMA</u> <u>Program Partners</u> we have if volunteers feel safer choosing from these vetted vendors.

#### **BI-LINGUAL RESOURCES**

GSEMA is investing in translating our key volunteer resources into multiple languages, starting with Spanish. This fall, we will be publishing Spanish versions of:

- New Leader's Guide to Success
- Volunteer Essentials
- Safety Activity Checkpoints
- Volunteer Policies and Procedures

*Going Places with Girl Scouts* will be a three (3) course Learning Path in gsLearn. These courses will replace Overnight Orientation and be complementary to Outdoor Basics Online, Outdoor Basics: Cooking, and Outdoor Basics: Camping. These courses do not replace or negate the Outdoor Basics courses, but will need to be completed in addition to them as needed for outdoor/camp adventures; here is the <u>Going Places with Girl Scouts</u> <u>Travel and Outdoor Progression Overview.</u>

- *Going Places with Girl Scouts I* was published in July and is active in gsLearn. This covers Local Field Trips, Day Trips, and Cook Outs, but <u>doesn't</u> cover any overnights.
- *Going Places with Girl Scouts II* will be published in the second week of September and will cover basic overnights and regional trips.
- *Going Places with Girl Scouts III* is slated for late October and will cover National and International Trips.


#### **Outdoor Program**
