- Performs beyond expectations for their volunteer position by supporting the council's mission-delivery goals in any of the following areas: membership, community development, supporting volunteers, marketing & public relations, fund development, communications, program delivery, or governance

- Review and approval are determined by the service unit, and may include a local committee to manage the process (deadlines, approval of nominations, and presentation of pins).
